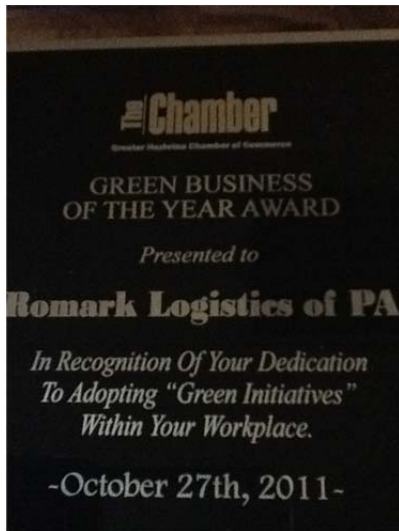


Chamber Recognizes Award Recipients at Luncheon
